

believed that a similar organization would serve the area well. Therefore in 1964, several people came together to form the "Corpus Christi Area Measurement Society." The group quickly formed a board of directors to guide the new organization.

Duke recalled that the first board consisted of Tiny Ledbetter (City of Corpus Christi Gas Superintendent), Don Darris, Henry Hubbert, Toddy Schulty, Herbert Goodenough, Bob Nickens, Howard Schultz, and Joe Vest. With a board in place, the organization blossomed into a group of approximately 25 members.

Another key period was 1989-90 when the Board decided to begin a measurement school. Of the 7 members of the Board at the time, each led a committee to organize the event.

At a cost of \$75 per student, training would include the areas of "gas measurement, controls, valves, and related measurement products." Vendors from companies that supplied the measurement industry displayed their products and were charged \$100 to attend.

The first school was held at the Corpus Christi Water District offices on Holly Road. Approximately 75 students attended, as well as approximately 100 vendors who set up in a large room "almost end to end."

And thus began a conversation within and outside the industry that has lasted 54 years. The story will continue in upcoming issues, so stay tuned!
